# TRANSITION

Livingston County Special Services Unit in partnership with local School Districts, Child & Family Connections, Birth to Three service providers and/or other agencies work together to assure an easy transition should a child be in need of specialized services to support success in the school environment.

When a child turns 30 months, with parent permission, the Child and Family Connections Service Coordinator calls a Transition Planning Meeting. The Parent, Coordinator, and Local School District Representative come together to discuss possible options for the child once they turn 3 years of age.

Between 2.6 years and 2.11 years the Early Learning Team (ELT) from a child's home district (see page 8) comes together to discuss the child's needs. Members of this Early Learning Team must include the Parent, School District Representative, and Assessment team member (s). It may also include Service Coordinator from Early Intervention, Program Supervisor, Therapists, Child Care provider, Pre-K and/or Early Childhood Special Education Teachers, and any other person necessary. After reviewing all gathered information, the ELT members may decide:

1. No services are needed at this time.
2. Information from the early intervention providers is adequate to make educational decisions.
3. Further evaluation is required to make decisions for the child's educational needs.

When evaluations (if needed) are completed and all relevant information is gathered, a decision for needed services is achieved by mutual respect and open communication between parents and professionals.

Options for instruction may include:

1. Local district Pre-K (at-risk) program
2. Speech/Language Therapy
3. Occupational/Physical Therapy as a related service
4. Early Childhood Special Education
5. Dual enrollment in Pre-K, Early Childhood Special Education, Kindergarten, Head Start and/or Even Start

Services are provided in the least restrictive environment in the student's home school whenever possible. However, some students require very specialized and intensive instruction and, therefore, may attend programs in neighboring school districts or specialized schools.

**CFC** is the central point through which families enter the Illinois Early Intervention Services System. This program is for children birth to three years of age who have developmental delays or a medical diagnosis. Referrals can be made by parents, nurses, grandparents, social workers, doctors, teachers, friends or any concerned individual. If a child is eligible for services, an Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) meeting is held to develop a program to meet the child's needs.

Services may include one or more of the following: developmental therapy, physical therapy, audiology, occupational therapy, assistive technology, transportation, speech/language therapy, nutrition services, medical diagnostic services, nursing services, service coordination, social work services and special instructions.



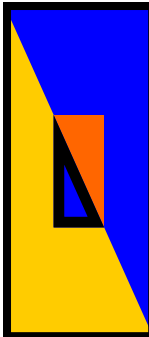

The **LCLIC** advises and assists the CFC in the coordination of local people and resources necessary to implement a comprehensive service delivery system. Members include service providers, parents, local agency and school representatives. Meetings are held on a regular basis to identify and fill gaps in services and to develop strategies for public awareness, child find, provider recruitment and transition activities. The two major community activities the LCLIC sponsors are:

The Annual Free Picnic held in early June is for children and their families who have received or are receiving Special Education services. The picnic includes an informational fair with local and state agencies participating. Each booth also sponsors an activity for the kids, with prizes given for participation! A bounce house, horse back rides, petting zoo, obstacle course, and a featured entertainer provides everyone with a busy and happy day. The picnic, held at the 4-H park, has grown into an annual event with over 350 participants.

The Going, Giving, and Getting, the Extra Mile Conference is held in October each year. This free one day conference is for anyone living with or working with children Birth-6 years who have special needs. The GEM conference provides Speakers on current topics in education, health, family issues, etc. Informational booths and door prizes make the day informative and fun! Committee members come from various backgrounds such as teaching, nursing, child care, early intervention, etc. Each year a "theme" is carried out from costumes to decorations to break-out sessions. Almost everyone goes home with inspiration, information, and a door prize!

## Early Learning Team (ELT) Leaders

Each school district within Livingston County has an Early Learning Team. These teams are comprised of a transdisciplinary group of professionals and parents who meet to determine the needs of young children through a Problem Solving procedure. ## Early Childhood Special Education Classes

Early Childhood programs are designed to provide intensive instruction to young children, three to five years of age. A child may turn six while in the program. However, he would not be eligible if he turned six before the first day of school. Children who may be in need of services are brought before the Early Learning Team at the local school district. Their case is reviewed, and if all needed data is available, a decision may be made at that time. If more data needs to be gathered, questions are generated and assessment follows. A "Problem Solving" approach with a transdisciplinary team of professionals and parents is used to determine entitlement for services. Decisions concerning the need for intensive service are made based upon current and measurable data.
